



STRENGTHENING OUR MISSION

Awareness, growth, and sustainability are the cornerstones of our strategic plan. Over the past several years, your support accomplished much in these areas, including the creation of a new website, program curriculum embedded in a learning management platform that supports scalability, and stewarding relationships through veteran presentations and fundraising events.

This year, you strengthened our mission even more.

AWARENESS

For the first time, the chapter program has been promoted beyond word of mouth. Brochures for student recruitment and veteran outreach were developed for chapter use, and an educator brochure was created and sent to principals, history teachers, and English teachers at 157 high schools in districts where we currently have a school chapter. This resulted in 7 new school partners for FY 24, and 3 additional schools expressing future interest. This initiative will continue to expand with the aim to partner with 50 schools by FY 26.

GROWTH

Your support is helping to document how students' skills and character are enhanced each year they participate and interview veterans. Utilizing the Badgr Digital Credential system, students now earn VHP badges as they reach milestones in areas of leadership, interviews, civic engagement, scholarship, publishing, and character. Students can add the digital badge, which is embedded with skill and achievement data, to a resume, LinkedIn profile, or even a college application.



Veteran legacies inspire students to set goals and work hard to achieve their potential, which is why scholarships are an important component of our program. The Ahern family generously established the Boeggeman/Jones Civic Engagement Scholarship. This \$2,500 award recognizes a student's volunteerism and service to the community, through their participation in both VHP and activities with additional organizations.



The Character Badge is awarded after students earn any combination of four badges.

"Growing up, I did not have a support system. I braced every impact with force and extreme strain. My neighborhood was littered with crime at every doorstep and police on the sidelines. I was born into a small space that felt like a cage I had been trapped inside of for too long, trying to split open the metal bars of poverty. Abuse was not a stranger, and addiction became a friend to the people I knew close to me. I knew I had to escape this way of life, and the only way of breaking free was by seeking a higher education. Entering high school, I challenged myself to get involved, succeed academically, and find a means of building a sustainable future. This led me to joining VHP.

VHP has achieved wonders for my character, leadership, and communication skills. Comparing my first day of freshman year to now, I am no longer shy, I speak confidently and

proudly, and I have become a stronger leader. VHP has sparked a devotion that is unmatched because it filled the missing piece I had inside of me. It gave me three things—mentors, purpose, and guidance.

The biggest lesson I learned was from Admiral Hal Pittman. The lesson: Life has its defining moments. You will be stretched like a rubber band. You will be pushed, challenged, and face obstacles. But no matter what, look for those defining moments and succeed above all else.

Over these past four years, I have grown into an individual who earned a scholarship to Yale, when it seemed more than likely I was going to fail. VHP gave me the drive to push forward in the face of adversity to believe in myself and to explore my educational opportunities."




FY 23 FINANCIAL SUMMARY
